


Cancer-related neuropathic pain (CRNP) is one of these consequences4

Actions are required to improve the diagnosis and management of **CRNP** to enhance quality of life of cancer patients and survivors



2 in 5 have not received a formal diagnosis of CRNP

Provision of better treatments to help manage **CRNP** is key for 73% of patients



30% have had to retire/ stop working



The quality of the patienthealthcare professional relationship is critical

for receiving a formal diagnosis of CRNP and a high patient's treatment satisfaction⁵

86% of patients have no or little knowledge about CRNP



There are differences in CRNP experience depending on the stage of the patient's cancer journey.

Cancer survivors⁶ are less likely to have been 47% had no formal diagnosed diagnosis
